Law Library LSA X USSU Team December 05, 2023

Notes:

- Law Students Association X USSU
 - Seeking responsibilities be delegated to the LSA
 - Have about 16 students ready to take on this role
 - Jason Kovitch's response:
 - USSU was approached by the library to provide this service due to payroll and accountability concerns
 - The library is the factor that is restricting the LSAs, and our client is not the LSA but rather the College of Law
 - USSU undertook an extra service
 - The Library made the conscious choice to shut it down pre-emptively
 - We have ample staff that can help provide that service –
 we will communicate with the library that we need at least an hour before such service is omitted
 - Alternatives that the College of Law has communicated to the USSU
 - If the USSU does not offer this service, extended hours will not be provided to the college as the College of Law is uncomfortable with the LSA representatives volunteering
 - o Akanksha Ganguly's response:
 - Collecting ID information from Law students is important due to the fact that:
 - Safety concerns
 - Sexual assault concerns
 - Theft concerns
 - Can a committee be created under the USSU for Law Students
 - That is neither a possible nor a practical solution
 - Can the LSA president be given the authority to join the student crew
 - Akanksha's response:
 - Tensions are running high in the student crew
 - Rude emailing
 - Treatment at the AGM
 - Student crew feeling targeted

- The student who backed out of the shift was present at the AGM
- Felt threatened by the tone of the Law students presenting the case + the emails that the student crew had been receiving from Law students
- President Ishita Mann's response:
 - Suggested mediation between Graham and the student crew and requested more empathy and compassion in emails
 - Acknowledge that stating facts is important, but there is a way of doing it
 - Empathy is necessary
 - Expressed the need for collaboration
- LSA President expressed agreement with President Ishita Mann and proposed to do mediation with the students
- Unfair treatment of USSU staff will never be tolerated and
- Brought up past discussions with Library leadership regarding providing key fobs to law students
 - Jason Kovitch's response:
 - The long-term solution in the coming
 - The Student Crew is still the primary response
- President Mann brought up some discussion points with Rachel Serjeant Jenkins
 - Law Library only runs Monday through Thursday (5PM to 9PM) whereas Murray Library runs 7 days a week till 12 AM
 - Lobbying for a unified LSA x USSU
