- (c) advising the Union on measures, initiatives, and/or opportunities that would help to strengthen relationships between the Union, including its departments and operations, Indigenous Students and the broader Indigenous community;
- (d) developing, organizing, and/or running initiatives, projects, and campaigns dedicated to Indigenous Student issues;

- (e) supporting the Indigenous Student leaders and/or the broader Indigenous community to develop, organize, and/or running initiatives, projects, and campaigns dedicated to Indigenous Student issues;
- (f) meeting at minimum twice per term;
